## ST. JOSEPH'S HOSPITAL HEALTH CENTER

Theodore M. Pasinski served as president and CEO at St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center from 1994 through 2010. Employed with the organization since 1974, Pasinski worked in finance and human resources

prior to joining the administrative team.

During his 17-year tenure as president, Pasinski effectively led a world-class team of hospital administrators, physicians, nurses, and staff in the daily delivery of high-quality health care to a 16-county region of central upstate New York.

Under his guidance, St. Joseph's has been designated a Magnet Hospital for Excellence in Nursing since 2002 by the American Nurses Credentialing Center. The organization has consistently scored high on national benchmarking studies, and today continues to be ranked among the top 5 percent in the nation for overall cardiac care.

The philanthropic and fundraising arm of the hospital — St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center Foundation — also benefited from Pasinski's direction. In his role as foundation chairperson, he coupled his successful leadership acumen with his desire to actively raise



funds for state-of-the-art, innovative medical care for the patients served by St. Joseph's — many of whom are unemployed, the working poor, refugees, those with disabilities, and others in need.

Pasinski continues to help St. Joseph's in a variety of ways, serving as a consultant to the leadership team, assisting with development activities, and representing the organization in the community.

Pasinski received his bachelor's degree in business administration from Siena College and a master's degree in business administration from Syracuse University. □

- Strengthened employee relations throughout the St. Joseph's organization.
- Led the growth of St. Joseph's and its affiliated Franciscan Companies; together, the organizations are top employers and economic engines in Central New York.
- Established the current facilities master plan for the main hospital campus, including a brand new lobby, pedestrian bridge, parking garage, and now an expanded emergency-services building. Provided for the foundation for the last phase of the current plan, which will build new operating-room suites and all-private patient rooms.
- Formed strategic partnerships with other groups/agencies, etc., for the revitalization of the Prospect Hill neighborhood.
- Preserved patient care in the Franciscan tradition, upholding the original mission of the Sisters of St. Francis who founded St. Joseph's more than 140 years ago.
