

# Robert U. Roberts

Retired President/CEO  
**SRC, INC.**

**R**obert U. Roberts recently retired as president and CEO of SRC, Inc., formerly Syracuse Research Corporation, after more than 20 years of service. Roberts brought 38 years of experience in program planning, development, and management to SRC. He is an expert in business strategies and development for both the U.S. government and the private sector. He remains on the board of trustees for SRC, and on the board of directors for its wholly owned manufacturing subsidiary, SRCtec, Inc. During his tenure, the SRC organization grew to employ more than 1,100 individuals, in 15 offices across the country.

Roberts' knowledge and leadership greatly advanced SRC's capabilities to support numerous customers, including the Department of Defense, the intelligence community, and the Environmental Protection Agency, contributing to the economic vitality of the Central New York area. Even in retirement, Roberts continues to improve the quality of life in his community through his service on the boards of numerous local nonprofit organizations.

His legacy to Central New York, and SRC, is being a steadfast advocate for access to affordable, high-quality education. This includes having played a vital role in the growth of the Onondaga Community College Foundation through his service as co-chair of the college's Reach Beyond campaign, the largest capital campaign in the college's history.

In addition, he is the chair of the Leadership Council of the Say Yes to Education Syracuse, a landmark collaboration between the Syracuse School District, Syracuse



University, and many local corporate, non-profit, and philanthropic organizations committed to increasing high school and college graduation rates for city residents.

Prior to joining SRC, Roberts was director of program development for Ultrasystems Defense, Inc. where he was responsible for new program development in systems engineering and software and hardware development. He also directed the development of strategic teaming relationships with major aerospace companies for the company.

Roberts also worked for Kodak Company and its affiliates, where he launched new businesses and expanded the existing customer base. He developed, implemented, and managed new management tools and was instrumental in increasing revenue.

Additionally, Roberts served 20 years with a distinguished career in the U.S. Air Force. He is a graduate of the Air Force Institute of Technology Systems Management.

Roberts currently serves on the board of directors of the CenterState CEO. He is a member the Intelligence and National Security Alliance; the ESF President's Council at the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry; the U.S. Air Force Communications and Electronics Association; and the Association of Old Crows. He also serves on the advisory board for the L.C. Smith College of Engineering and Computer Science at Syracuse University. □
